WEEK 1 - WHO IS THE LIGHT?

- John 1:1-9
- John 9:3-5
- John 12:46



"God is light," says John in his opening chapter (1 John 1:5), "and in Him is no darkness at all." David declares, "For it is you who light my lamp; the Lord my God lightens my darkness." (Psalm 18:28)



The Psalmist cries out, "The Lord is God, and he has made his light to shine upon us. Bind," he cries out, "the festal sacrifice with cords, up to the horns of the altar!" (Psalm 118:27). Celebration is due to the glorious light of our God that He so lovingly shines upon us! Oh, that we celebrate His light!

Jesus is the true light—as so lovingly proclaimed by John (John 1:9). God's light came into this world through the submission of Jesus Christ. He came and dwelt among us. To those who witnessed God in the flesh, Jesus says, "The light is among you for a little while longer. Walk while you have the light, lest darkness overtake you. The one who walks in the darkness does not know where he is going. While you have the light, believe in the light, that you may become sons of light." (John 12:35-36)

The Holy Spirt is–in His very character–the Light, for God is light. However, there is not a specific Scripture passage that shines the light of the Holy Spirit of himself. He is here to draw the world to the light (John 3:8). The Holy Spirit truly enters into the reality of each soul as they are and where they are. He willingly meets us in our darkest hour, in the depths of our hidden sin, and patiently brings us to the light. We know that He is God and therefore light, yet in our darkness He meets us in the right amount of brightness. Such love of our God to enter darkness for our salvation!

Simple Truth

WEEK 3 - WALK IN THE LIGHT

Oh, that we will walk as children of light!

- Ephesians 5:8-21
 - Be a reflection of Jesus for the world to see!



The world needs us. It needs to see the hope in us. We are a reflection of Christ. This is not a "should be" goal in life. It is a definite truth as a Christian. As you are—you are a light of the world. Where you are—you are a light of the world. Walk in that!



Do not *try* to shine or *want* to shine. Simply, shine! You are the light of the world whether you think you are or not; for you are a Christian, a light of the world.

The same Holy Spirit who met you in your sin to bring you to the Light now resides within you to walk with you as the light. You are not alone in this radiant journey. You do not have to rely on your flesh and personal ability to produce light. The Holy Spirit who brought you into the Light will ever be with you to grow you. He did the work in your salvation; allow Him to do the work in your sanctification (growth). As He is working in you, you worship in song-both in your heart to the Lord and in the ears of others. What a fascinating assignment given to us by Paul in Ephesians 5:19. Starting today, say thank you to God for all things in the name of Jesus Christ your Lord. Be vocal in your conversation with God throughout the day. Lift up your voice in sentences of thankfulness for, well, everything.

Personal challenge: replace your pressure of "Being a good light to the world" with the simple act of verbalizing praise to God throughout your day. Remembering that as you are worshiping in song and saying thank you to God in the name of Jesus Christ your Lord, the Holy Spirit is at work in you—the light of the world.

WEEK 4 - BRIGHTER THAN DARKNESS

- 2 Corinthians 4
- 1 Thessalonians 5:4-6
 - As children of the light we should be steadfast and ready for His coming. Let's not be surprised at what will come.
- 1 John 1:5-7; 2:8-11



Key "light shining players" according to 2 Corinthians 4 are God, Jesus Christ, servants of Christ, you, and Satan.



A key truth to remember is: it is not about you. It's about Jesus, always. Satan knows and is fighting to blind the eyes of those who are lost to the Way, the Truth, and the Life that is called Jesus Christ. The servants of Christ, as Paul defines he and his partners, are also well aware of the dynamic between the Light and darkness. They know their place. They know their purpose. And they know what Name they are to proclaim.

A key challenge, if you will, definitely presents itself before our eyes. 2 Corinthians 4 describes our "Jar of clay" as a simple source meant for eternal glory. This is an image, a truth, almost too hard to comprehend. Yet, in our clay, we are given a place in the kingdom of God with a purpose to be a light to the world around us by proclaiming the name of Jesus. This personal challenge has nothing to do with us. For we are a jar of clay growing older by the day. But Jesus is the eternal Son of God who demonstrated His love for the world and has promised to come again.

There we are, today, waiting for the return of Jesus Christ and proclaiming His name so that—as grace extends to more and more people—thanksgiving, to the glory of God, may abound.

WEEK 5 - OUT OF DARKNESS

 - Be steadfast in the truth even when the culture would call you evil.



To live in the light, fully, is what we aim to live for, is it not? We know what it looks like to live in the darkness, fully. We remember. We can see it, taste it, feel it....



We know its comfort and its warmth in a strange, familiar way. We remember because we "once were" a person without the love of Jesus Christ within us.

But now. But now we are no longer that person of emptiness, of darkness. We are chosen, royal, holy, owned. And in this new way, this new truth, we are now a person with an intent purpose. That purpose is to be a declaration of one who is out of darkness and in the light.

The question that stumps us is, what does that look like? We know what it looks like to walk in darkness, for that is the story of our past. We've walked that. We've lived that. But to walk in the Light is new. And it is ever new. The newness of walking in the light of God is always new. Always, the Spirit is working within us, opening our eyes to a new freedom found in the Word of God that draws us closer to God and further from the darkness of yesterday. This process is always happening, so we are always learning what it looks like to walk in the light. This is faith, is it not? This is wonderful. It is exciting and scary and beautiful and trusting.

This is life out of darkness.

Simple Truth

Ah, treasures. How greatly they affect our hearts! I suppose the first thing we must do is open our treasure chest. Will you consider looking intently to list each "jewel" that casts a glimmer in your eyes?



Perhaps you will list the names of hearts that you hold as dear as gold. Perhaps you will see temporal treasures sparkling in the midst of eternal beauties. I don't know what sits in your treasure chest. What do you see?

The Bible tells us that our eyes are the reflection of the light that sets our soul aflame. Consider Moses and Stephen. The faces of these men shone as they gazed upon God. The treasure that sat within their hearts spilled out of their eyes as their eyes were set upon God alone.

Look at the eyes of a groom as his bride walks down the aisle or read the expression of a mom as she holds her very heart in her arms. These eyes express the treasures within. Love. Love for the person to whom they promise to have and to hold, to protect and guide. Sweet friend, whether we admit it or not, our eyes give us away. What makes your eyes light up? The answer to this question will reveal what is favored within your heart. Does the name of Jesus light up your eyes or is His name simply the name of the One who saved your soul? Does Scripture set your heart on fire causing your eyes to dream about eternity with your God or is the Bible simply on your to-do list? Jesus tells us to embrace treasures in heaven and to do that while living today. Practically speaking, how do we do that? What does that look like?

WEEK 7 - THE LIGHT OF THE WICKED

- Job 18:5-6; 21:17; 38:15
- Luke 11:35-36
- Proverbs 13:9
- Proverbs 24:20



What happens when we study our treasure and conclude that its reflection is dim or even altogether dark? What then? Solution: 1 John 1:9; Ephesians 5. Wake up, sleeper, and let His face shine upon you.



Reflect. Allow His shining to shine on you. Don't try to glitter on your own—you'll probably just look like you're "glistening.";) Let His light do the work. You sit in His radiance. Let it wash over you, thoroughly.

The light of the wicked has an end—a seemingly hopeless end. But God is not done with their truth. He has given His children as a light. It is the hope of the wicked. Consider the brightness of your light in the eyes of the one overcome by the darkness.

Ponder what God can do when we are willing to show up in the darkness of another. Not that we are partaking in the darkness, but we are willing to show up beside the human that is in the shadow. The light of Jesus Christ is brighter than the light of the wicked. Their light is temporary. May we not allow ourselves to be blinded by the light of man. Rather, may we be the fullness of light eternal to those who are blinded by the light of man. Oh, that we will remember who we are and whose light is manifested in us! One day we will see our identity, fully. I declare it is time to wrap our head around that future identity and shine the fullness of that light today.

May we pray that souls will be drawn to Jesus through our grasping of the warmth of His Light upon us. Job 33:27-28

WEEK 8 - THE LIGHT OF THE WORD

Thy word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path. We know this. We say this. Do we do it? Do we know how to turn on the lamp and how to see the path in its light?



What does it mean to open the Bible and shine it upon our feet? Isn't that what it is saying? John tells us that the Word was in the beginning, that It was with God, and that It was God. The very Word of God is Jesus Christ, the eternal Son of God. The author and the finisher of your faith. The one who was and is and is to come. The sword that cuts the bone from the marrow. The spoken breath of life and the final word of darkness' fatality.

The Word of God is alive as Jesus is alive. And, today, you and I hold the very living breath of Jesus Christ in our hands. Selah.

Carry the Word of God with you wherever you go. Open its pages and read the words scripted throughout its books and letters. Study the depths of its Truth. Ask questions. Seek the Spirit's wisdom, knowledge, and understanding. See the way in which it is illuminating your heart. Listen. Sit in silence. And follow Him.

That is faith. To behold the Word of God as your lamp and the light to your path is a very demonstration of your faith in the Son of God.

WEEK 9 - LIVE IN THE LIGHT

- Psalm 97:11

It's time to shine as we are—today. The question remains, What does that look like for you? We have seen the world around us. We have identified the temporary light of the darkness. And we are learning to embrace the light that illuminates our feet at every moment.

Together, let us shine the light of Jesus as we are and where we are—illuminated within and without by the Eternal Light of our Risen Savior, Jesus Christ.









Forgiveness stirs up multiple emotions within our souls. May we sit in the Master's Hand to see what forgiveness looks like from that viewpoint.




Jesus & Me Today

Scripture declares, "Jesus is coming again." But what does that truth look like in our daily lives? Learn how to live today as you earnestly wait for tomorrow.




But God!
